

Prof. M Samba Siva Raju,
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& Head I/c Department of Music
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<u>Prof. M Samba Siva Raju</u> is specialized in Sound (Dhwani). He has a rare combination of having a thorough knowledge of music (Carnatic) and dance (Kuchipudi and Bharatanatyam). He always believes in the sound that motivates the movement. He feels that the sound dictates the movement of grammar/vocabulary. The whole grammar of movement patterns of any dance form relies upon the permutation and combinations of sound vibration, sound sustenance, and sound evaporation. He speaks to his students that nothing is simple and nothing is complex. A simple sound can be made very complex and similarly, a complex sound can be made very simple. It all depends on the way each individual looks at it. The human body of a dancer draws beautiful drawing lines on the space given just as a painter draws on canvas. Though his background initially was traditional, he changed his approach totally after entering the

modern educational system. He believes the dance and the music are abstract. He always says that the human body should not confine to a particular grammar but it should always get exposed to as many languages as possible. Then the movement vocabulary will become more poetic.

Besides, Prof. Samba Siva Raju is an established dancer, music composer, and choreographer. He has designed and choreographed more than a dozen dance ballets, six large group compositions using about 500 participants for national events, and many solo numbers, which received appreciation from the art lovers. He also designed and produced dance compositions for electronic media too

Presently, Prof. Samba Siva Raju is working as a professor in the Department of Dance, S.N. School of Arts and Communication, University of Hyderabad, Hyderabad, and has completed 22 years of his teaching (regular) at the University of Hyderabad. He completed his headship between 2015 - and 2018. He is presently heading the department of music.

Innovation in Teaching

Did innovation in teaching by introducing a course titled 'Musical Aspects of Dance - I' & II' for the first time at the Post-Graduate level in order for the students of dance in managing /dealing musical components of dance performance in which they are involved as either a Performer/Choreographer or Nattuvanar. To help them get the music composed for their dance performance according to their design/vision by collaborating knowledgeably with the music composer. To help them perform/choreograph a dance properly appreciating, understanding, experiencing, and responding to the music used for it. The course consists of both theory and practical. The theory component includes the knowledge of concepts. The practical component includes listening, reporting/appreciating/criticizing/and reviewing music.

Developed Curriculum

Actively involved in the Curriculum Development of the MPA Dance Programme for the Department of Dance, S. N. School of Arts and Communication, University of Hyderabad. Most of the courses have been designed by me to broaden the current context of teaching dance. The curriculum for the dance department came into force from the academic year 2003 - 2004.
